PROP 1

CALIFORNIA'S \$7.12 BILLION WATER BOND

Authorizes \$7.12 billion in general obligation bonds for state water supply infrastructure projects.

Pro: Prop 1 will improve access to and quality of drinking water statewide by funding water quality projects in several categories: safe drinking water, recycled water, regional water security, groundwater sustainability and coastal/river protection. The bond allocates more than a half-billion dollars to projects that provide safe drinking water and affordable wastewater treatment to the most at-risk residents of California, including those who have lost their water supply in the current drought. Prop 1 will make a critical difference for communities with serious and urgent water challenges.

Con: Proposition 1 is an expensive and unfair taxpayer giveaway to special interests that won't solve the drought or help secure our water future. It allocates over \$3.6 billion, without oversight by the legislature, to build dams and pay for water transfers for corporate agribusiness. Prop 1 with interest will cost CA taxpayers \$14.4 billion or \$360 million per year for 40 years out of our State's general fund, money that could be used for other needs like education and healthcare.

PROP 46

HIGHER MEDICAL MALPRACTICE PENALTIES AND DRUG TESTING FOR DOCTORS

Increases the malpractice damages cap to \$1 million for the first time since 1975 to account for nearly four decades of inflation. Also requires mandatory drug testing for ALL Doctors, raising concerns from privacy advocates and the drug policy community.

PROP 47

SMARTER SENTENCING FOR NONVIOLENT CRIMES

Significantly rolls back the wasteful, racist "War on Drugs" and alleviates prison overcrowding in California. Reduces penalties from felony to misdemeanor for most nonviolent crimes, and redirects savings to rehabilitative programs and schools.

REFERENDUM ON INDIAN GAMING CASINO

Ratifies two gaming compacts and exempts execution of the compacts and intergovernmental agreements from the California Environmental Quality Act.

GOV. BROWN'S RAINY DAY FUND

Installs a new requirement that would siphon off revenue every year for a rainy day fund. Requiring the Legislature to set aside funds desperately needed to repair damages acquired during the Great Recession. It's bad policy to pour money into a rainy day fund when it's still raining.

INITIATIVE TO REGULATE INSURANCE RATES

Puts the brakes on skyrocketing health insurance rates. Requires health insurance companies to justify rate increases to the public and receive approval for any increases by the California Insurance Commissioner.
